

Central Asia problems were discussed at the Institute of History and Law

On 24 November , 2017, at the Department of World History of the Institute of History and Law was held an international scientific and practical conference "International Relations in Central Asia: History and Modernity".

During the conference were discussed following issues: problems of international relations in the region; modern policy of the Central Asian states; the entry of Central Asian countries into the world educational space; historical foundations of the formation of Turkic languages and their role as a factor uniting the Turkic-speaking peoples of the region; ethnopolitical and socio-economic processes taking place in the region and neighboring countries; the emergence of a new legal system. The conference was held in four specialized sections, the working languages of the conference were Kazakh, Russian and English.
